<p>2-KB- Mrs. Brazell - Understanding that DMLSS is a very proficient system for supply chain and logistics, has the TAC considering there may be better systems for the service management of medical and facilities equipment?</p> <p>Defense Medical Logistics Standard Support (DMLSS) is an existing Government off the Shelf (GOTS) solution that meets the threshold of the existing VA requirement. Pursuant to a thorough VA Analysis of Alternatives (AoA) in 2018, VA leadership decided to adopt and implement DMLSS as a managed service, and its technical refresh, LogiCole, as a Software as a Service (SaaS) as its healthcare logistics and supply chain management solution. Further, it is important to note that DMLSS will support the VA's enterprise-wide integration and data sharing efforts with systems supporting Office of Electronic Health Record Modernization (OEHRM) and Financial Management Business Transformation (FMBT) initiatives. VA's decision to adopt DMLSS is consistent with 38 U.S. CODE § 8111 (Sharing of Department of Veterans Affairs and Department of Defense health care resources) Federal Information Security Modernization Act (FISMA), and the Federal Financial Management Improvement Act of 1996 (FFMIA).</p> <p>The TAC's involvement is limited to processing the interagency agreement with DoD to fund the efforts.</p>
